## SUMMER AUTOTEST CHAMPIONSHIP (updated 2024)

1. Ross and District Motor Sports Limited will organise an Autotest Championship, running from the first event in late spring until the last event in Autumn (Usually May, June, July, Aug, Sep)

All events will be of Clubman status, only RS clubman Licence is required. There will be no need to register for the championship, competitors will automatically score points as detailed below. Competitors must be current R&DMSL members to score points.

Classes: 1. Front wheel drive (amalgamation of event classes A1 & PCA1)
3. Rear wheel drive (amalgamation of event classes A3 & PCA3)

Four-wheel drive cars are not permitted to enter. M&S or Town & Country tyres or 'grip' tyres are not permitted.

- 3. Positions in class will be used to determine the points scored. First in class will score 20 points, second in class will score 19 points, and so on down to a minimum of 1 point. Where there are less than three entries in class, the above points will be reduced by one.
- 4. There will be several events of a similar nature. If there are nine or eight events then five scores will count, if there are seven or six events then four scores will count, if there are five or four events then three scores will count. If there are less than three events the championship may not run, decision will go to committee. There is no requirement to marshal on one of the events. The event dates will be made known in the appropriate publications.
- 5. Ties in the championship will be resolved by considering, in order: -
- a. Highest number of maximum points in all events in the series.
- b. Highest number of second places in all events in the series, and so on.
- c. Highest number of competitors in class on the final event.
- d. Best (lowest) total time on the final event.
- 6. There is no fee to enter the championship, it is FREE.
- 7. There will be no awards at each event, only for the championship. An award will be presented to the overall winner of the championship. Awards will also be presented to the winner of each class, and the first novice and first lady subject to five entries in class. A novice is defined as anyone who has competed in less than six autotests within the last four years. Novice status at the first event will be retained through the season.
- 8. The events will have different organisers, but each event will have the same Supplementary Regulations but with date changes to suit each event. The regs and the online entry form for each event will be on the Ross and District Motor Sports Club website www.rossmotorsports.co.uk under the event page.
